

Advantages of a diverse trustee board

- Broader range of trustee skills, knowledge and experience
- Greater assurance that a charity is fair and open in all its dealings
- Increased accountability for the charities actions

Difficulties considering young people in governance roles

- Lack of time to involve young people (17% of responses)
- Young People not interested (17%)
- Cost of involving young people (13%)
- Lack of senior staff buy-in (13%)
- Resistance from older committee/ board members (12%)
- Difficult to support young people (12%)
- Difficult to find young people (12%)
- Organisation does not have the expertise (4%)

Pathways into the trustee role

- Many young people didn't realise the trustee role existed
- Natural extension of a volunteering role
- Already committed to the charity and its cause

Young people's contribution to a trustee's board

- Bringing new ideas, new ways of doing things, and harnessing technology
- Bringing renewed energy
- Increasing the charity's networking opportunities
- Bringing a service-user voice

The value of the volunteer and trustee experience

- Building self-respect and respect from others
- Enhancing the CV and labour market prospects
- Opportunity to develop specific skills
- Development of decision making and management skills
- Increased maturity and confidence in handling responsibility.

Difficulties encountered by young trustees

- Limited experience and the need to prove themselves
- Limited induction and mentoring
- Not being taken seriously
- Lack of confidence shown in them by service users
- Time management issues

Analysis and conclusions


- Encourage young people to work on materials to promote trusteeship to their peers
- Volunteering is a key route into charity trusteeship for young people
- Charities should value their young trustees
- Many benefits from young people's involvement as a trustee
- Long term benefits for charity
- Benefits for the charity of having a diverse board
