Inspection

Check equipment a month before the start
Hand in *completed* inspection form to Mobile Race Office on arrival


- Check for rule changes when Rules
 published in January
 - Check equipment a month before the start Hand in *completed* inspection form to Mobile Race Office on arrival
- One hour time slot arranged for inspection
- Experienced English speaking crew available during inspection
- All pyrotechnics, EPIRB, first aid kit etc laid out or accessible, expiry dates visible



Non-Conformities

- List of identified non-conformities left with vessel, if applicable
- Vessel advises Mobile Race Office as soon as non-conformities rectified
- Re-inspection
- Race Captain signs Race Declaration at back of form (if not done previously)
- All done, have a beer!






