 Kotka opted for innovations in sustainability i.e. we offered the event as platform for experimentation

Kotkamills

- Kotkamills donated to the event cups and plates that were made from 100% recyclable carton. The specific innovation in their carton is that it does not contain plastic at all. Therefore, the carton can be recycled among normal paper recycling, and the fibres can be used for paper manufacturing. The wood based fiber can be used up to 6 times. Our partner city Turku also adopted this.



Circular Economy
